Q&A with the Royal Marsden team

The **ROYAL MARSDEN**
Life demands excellence

The Royal Marsden Hospital, have been very successful in recruiting to PREVENTT, having enrolled **110** patients to the study in total. This is nearly one in every four PREVENTT patients enrolled. This month, we caught up with the PI, Dr Ravi Raobaikady and Research Nurse, Sister Ethel Black to find out some of the secrets to their success.

Q: How does your research team screen patients?

A: Patients are screened through the electronic patient record every week, looking at the different clinics and theatre list for the coming months. Some patients are referred by the teams. We discuss with CNS, ANP if they have patients who are eligible for the trial. If there is enough time before they come to the pre assessment unit they are sent information about PREVENTT.

New trial statistician

I'm Matt and I have recently started working as the statistician for PREVENTT. I will be helping to monitor the safety and efficacy of the trial (in co-operation with the independent Data and Safety Monitoring Committee) and also the validity of the data received. Q: What have you enjoyed about PREVENTT?

A: The training and support given from the PREVENTT trials team.

Q: What do you think makes the Royal Marsden such a great PREVENTT site?

A: There is good communication between the different departments (consultants, nurses and doctors), patients are aware of trials, they are willing to participate especially if they are told that it can all be done on one visit.

Q: What does your team do to maintain such impressive recruitment numbers?

A: Our Research Nurse goes to the clinics to remind the consultants that the trial is still ongoing and goes to the pre assessment unit to see if there is a walk-in patient who can be recruited to the trial. Also PI and Co investigators are actively involved in pre-assessment process and available to the recruitment process anytime.
